### Key Stage 2 SATs Results 2017

Below are the provisional KS2 SATs results. I am very pleased to say that this year our results are in line or above national and Tower Hamlets average. However, it is also important to remember that SATs are a snapshot of a very specific area of a child's development. If a child has done their best they have not failed. Well done to all of Year 6 who worked extremely hard preparing for their SATs and for the support received from their parents and teachers.

The pupils' raw score in the test is converted in to a scaled score. A scaled score of 100 or more shows a child has met the expected standard in the test. A scaled score of 110-120 shows high achievement on the test. If you are interested there is more information on our website about scaled scores.
