







































































































EYFS Maths Mastery: Five Minute Filler Addition (30-50 & 40-60 Months) PowerPoint




Phase 2 and 3 Tricky Words on Bees Coming Out of Hive PowerPoint

Activity Ideas: Ask your grown-up to write the tricky words on pieces of paper and hide them around the room. Take it in turns to find and read the words.

Activity Ideas: Go into the garden or a nearby green space and see if you can find any real minibeasts. Try looking under leaves, stones or logs. You could take photos or draw a sketch of the creatures that you find.

Activity Ideas: As you read the story, talk about the different seasons. What is your favourite season? Why?







Reading Simple Sentences

Home Learning Challenges



Ask a grown-up to hide a teddy or other toy around the house. Get them to write some simple clues such as 'on the chair', 'in


the box' or 'under the bed'. Follow the hunt to see if you can find the teddy.

Ask a grown-up to write a secret sentence and cut it up into words. Ask them to mix up the order of the words. See if you can read the words and put them into the correct order to make the sentence.


Ask a grown-up to write some instructions to make a special snack. This could be a sandwich or even a biscuit! An example of a sentence could be: 'Take a slice of bread.' Read the sentences and follow the instructions to make the secret treat!

Choose a picture book that you enjoy or that looks interesting. Use the words you recognise and the pictures.

Can you read somebody a bedtime story?



Ask a grown-up to draw a noughts and crosses grid on a large piece of paper and to write a simple sentence in each square. Take it in turns to read a sentence before you mark your X or O. If you want to reuse the grid you could use different coloured buttons or counters to mark the sentences instead.







Reading Tricky Words

Home Learning Challenges

Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words on pieces of paper and hide them around the room.

Have a tricky word hunt to find and read the words.

Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words onto white paper using a white wax crayon or (unlit) candle. Paint over the top using watered down paint. What words can you find?



Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words in chalk on the fence or ground outside.
When they say a word, can you find it and squirt it with your water shooter?


Write tricky words onto empty plastic bottles to create skittles. Ask a grown-up to call out a tricky word and try to knock down the correct bottle with a large ball.

Understanding Text

Home Learning Challenges





Read a storybook with a grown-up. When you have finished, ask your grown-up questions about the story. Were they correct?

Draw a picture of a story you have read and enjoyed. Can you tell your grown-up about the picture you have drawn?



Collect some objects or pictures from around your home. Ask a grown-up to write some simple sentences about the objects. Read them one at a time, then point to the matching object. For example, 'This is a red ball', 'The box is big.'

Ask a grown-up to write a simple sentence for you to read, such as 'The hen is in the box.' Can you read the sentence and then draw a picture to match the sentence?

Retell a story you have read using toys and puppets. Can you remember what happened in the story? Tell your grown-up the story through a puppet show.



Read a book with a grown-up and decide which character was your favourite. Draw a picture of them and talk about what they were like and why they were your favourite.








Using Phonic Skills for Reading

Home Learning Challenges

Play a game of phonics musical statues. Ask a grown-up to write some decodable words on pieces of paper (you could use words, such as boat, book, leaf). Put some music on and have a dance around. Once the music stops, run to one of the words and sound it out.

Ask a grown-up to write some words for items in the house, such as hat, toy, chair, bed, sink. Go on a hunt around the house and tick off all the objects on the checklist that you find.

Ask a grown-up to hide some objects in boxes. The objects must be items that can be decoded, for example a block, pen,




leaf, car, train. On each box, write a label of what is inside. Read the words on the box and check inside to see if you were right.



Use chalk to draw three circles onto the pavement outside. Ask a

grown-up to write a letter into each circle to make a word. Can you say each letter sound as you jump into the circles? What word did you sound out? Rex the Robot is saying some words. Can you say the letter sounds on Rex and then read the words?



Ask a grown-up to help you make word jigsaw puzzles. Write a word on a piece of paper and carefully cut it into pieces so that each letter sound is on a separate piece. Can you arrange the pieces and read the word?



Using Phonics Skills for Writing

Home Learning Challenges



Use your phonic skills to help your grown-up write a shopping list.

Use your phonics skills to make a poster to display in your bedroom window. It could show who you want to say thank you to or it could be a special message you would like to share.

Spread out big pieces of paper with letters written on them on the floor. Your grown-up can say a simple word and you can jump on and say the letters that make that word.




Spread a layer of sand, flour or uncooked rice into the base of a tray. Ask a grown-




up to say a word, then use your finger or a paintbrush to write the word into the sand. Try writing these words: sun, box, tap, coat, moon.

Writing Tricky Words

Dip a paintbrush into some water and paint some words on a dry surface outside, such as paving slabs. You could try writing these tricky words; all, said, the, into, was.



Create rainbow words. Ask a grown-up to write a tricky word onto paper using a pencil. Trace over the word several times, each time with a different colour from the rainbow.


Play a lucky dip game. Ask a grown-up to write out some tricky words onto small



pieces of paper, fold them up and place them in a container. Pull out a word and copy it onto paper or a whiteboard. You may like to try the words; he, she, we, me.



Tip a small amount of flour onto a flat surface and spread it out with your hand. Copy some tricky words into the flour using your finger. You could try writing; I, no, to, go. With the help of a grown-up, write some tricky words on pieces of paper and lay them on the floor, like a path. Jump along the path, saying each tricky word as you land on it.



Create a treasure hunt. Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words on paper and hide these around the house or garden. Search

> for the words and when you find one, write it down on a detective notepad.
